





Backyard Makeovers

To transform outdoor spaces, Creative Contour combines high technology with the human touch

atching Jennifer Noyes, owner of Creative Contour Landscape Design, do a virtual makeover of a client's yard is fascinating: She sits at her twin 24inch computer monitors before digital images of the client's property, and moves plants in and out of beds and borders with the click of a mouse. She might lay down a patio or a new walkway - or perhaps add a pergola - and then expertly selects perennials, annuals, shrubs and trees that are likely to

thrive in the conditions presented by that particular yard. In this way, Noyes is not only able to create before and after pictures of a client's property - she is able to create a "pre-after" shot as well, which allows her to show clients what their redesigned yard will look like before any soil is touched. "It's been said a billion times, but a picture is really worth a thousand words," says Noyes. "People have an instinctual need to know exactly what they are purchasing."





planting, while others rely on Noyes, Frank and their crew to do the entire installation.) "Some of our clients end up having us come back to do more of their property," Noves says, "because they are so happy with the results."

A Passion for Art and Gardening

Noyes, who has been designing landscapes for more than a decade, has been gardening for most of her life. She grew up in Westminster, Vermont, where she developed a passion for gardening at a young age. When she was only 10, a neighbor - and avid gardener - let Noyes work in her garden, and gave Noves her first lessons in horticulture. By the time Noves reached high school, she was working in nearby Putney for renowned landscape architect Gordon Hayward, the father of one her friends, helping to maintain his gardens. Noves ultimately obtained a degree in landscape design and ornamental horticulture from Vermont Technical College, her father's alma mater. She loves art, and has been drawing and painting flowers and plants since she was a child, so her chosen field unites her two passions.

Noves left Vermont to intern for Hertzog Associates, a landscape design firm in Stockton, New Jersey, but couldn't stay away from New England – and her family – for long. She moved to Connecticut in 2002, and worked



as a designer for other companies for a few years before venturing out on her own in 2007. Frank, who left his job with the City of Hartford last year to join up with Noyes, oversees all of Creative Contour's installations.

Imagination Meets Technology

Noyes' backyard makeovers begin long before the installation of a project. The first step is the consultation: Noyes visits a client's home, takes a slew of photographs, and interviews the property owners about their color and plant preferences, their lifestyle, and how they plan to use their yards. "All these questions help me to design better," she says. Noyes will often set up shared Pinterest pages with her

clients - where they can both post photos they find online for inspiration - and gets to work drawing up detailed plans. Using photographs of the client's existing outdoor space, Noves then produces the digital re-imaginings of the yard that help clients to better "see" her visions.

As Noyes drives along the winding roads that lead to her Middletown home and studio, she can't help redesigning her neighbors' yards in her mind. But she says she has even more fun when she's hired to implement her ideas and transform someone's outdoor space. Cynthia and Phil Ritola of Cheshire contacted Jennifer and Steve four years ago, because they wanted to clean up a hillside behind their home. However, when Noyes saw their property, she immediately had ideas for beautifying the entire prop-

erty. The Ritolas were so taken by Noyes' digital makeovers of other parts of their yard, they put the hillside project on hold and asked her to tackle a completely different project - then another, and yet another.

"Jennifer was able to show me that rather than having a scraggly patch of grass on the side of the house, I could have a walking path with bushes, making it look like a walk through the woods," says Cynthia Ritola. "She also showed me what it would look like to replace my scraggly deck with a stone stairway and patio - and how much it would open up the property to take down some of my trees." Noves and Frank have returned every year to work their magic on different parts of the property but have yet to tackle the hillside. Says Frank, "It's a joke amongst the four of us."

Though homeowners can find an array of computer software geared toward helping them design their own gardens virtually, Noves says the professional-grade software is much more sophisticated (not to mention pricey). And it takes a local professional to realize the vision that is right for a particular property's landscape and climate.


"I've had garden centers come and plant a tree for me, hoping they would know exactly where to plant it," says Simsbury resident Susan Asensio, who later hired Noyes to redesign her backyard. "But they said, 'Where do you want it?' And, then of course it didn't do well in the spot that I chose.' Noyes ultimately installed a bluestone patio with a sitting wall and stone fireplace on Asensio's property, and surrounded

> the "outdoor room" with a variety of flowering shrubs and trees that were well-suited to the yard's light and soil conditions. They not only survived, they flourished.
